It is extremely important to keep a record of the properties to which you apply. You can then update the properties if any of your information changes such as your phone number, mailing address, income info, household make-up, etc.

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS MAY BE REQUIRED TO APPLY FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES

- Birth Certificates for All Family Members
- Social Security Cards for All Family Members
- Driver's License or other Photo ID for All Members 18 Years of Age of Older
- Sources of Income and Addresses
- Bank Name and Address (Type of Account: Savings, Checking, or other Account)
- Current and Previous Landlord Names and Addresses

POTENTIAL QUESTIONS TO ASK A LANDLORD BEFORE SIGNING A LEASE

- What utilities am I responsible for? What utilities is the landlord paying?
- Where and how do I pay the rent? Do I receive receipts for rent paid?
- Who do I contact if there is a maintenance emergency?
- Appliances: Who is responsible for repairs? Replacement?
- Does the lease extend month-to-month after the fixed term (usually one year) or does it renew?

The \$1 Energy Fund provides cash assistance to utility customers to help them pay their utility bills. Hardship funds provide assistance grants to customers who "fall through the cracks" of other financial assistance programs, or to those who still have a critical need for assistance after other resources have been exhausted. The fund makes payments directly to companies on behalf of eligible customers.

Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)
